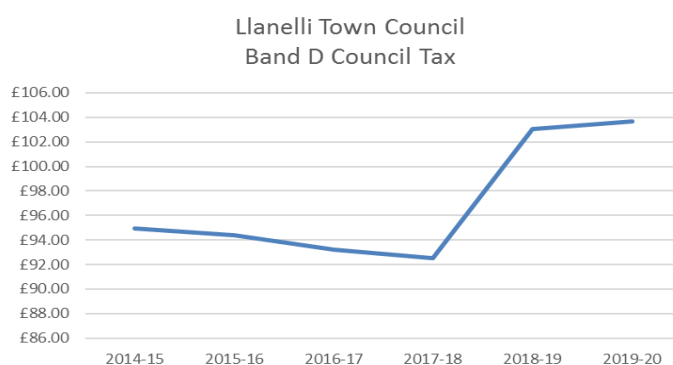


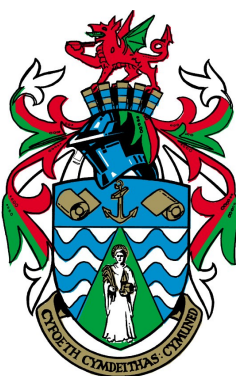
LLANELLI TOWN COUNCIL COUNCIL TAX NOTICE 2019/2020

Llanelli Town Council will precept £910,000 to be levied against the Council Taxpayers of Llanelli in order that the council can continue to maintain and improve the services important to our community. Band D properties will therefore see an increase in Council Tax from £103.04 in 2018-19 to £103.64 in 2019-20.



RECREATION AND SPORT

The Town Council provides excellent facilities at Stebonheath, home to Llanelli Town Football Club and West Wales Raiders Rugby League and at the Selwyn Samuel Centre. The Asset Transfer of Crown Park, Havelock Park, Parc y Dre and Penylan Park from the County Council was completed during 2018 with the Council now looking to complete the sub-leases with the local sports clubs and organisations in the near future. The Council continues to work with the County Council to maintain Penygaer Playing Fields and through the Town Council's financial contribution and membership of the Parc Howard Collaboration Group works in partnership with the County Council to manage Parc Howard, ensuring the facility is improved and remains in public ownership.



EVENTS AND PROMOTIONS

The Town Council funds the provision and maintenance of the Hanging Baskets in the Town Centre, these provide a blaze of colour through the summer months. The Council works closely with other organisations such as Y Lle and the Llanelli Business Improvement District to support a number of events arranged during the year which currently include the 80's Music Festival, Food Festival and Reindeer Parade. The Council also works with the County Council and Llanelli Rural Council to arrange and fund the Annual Christmas Carnival.

LLANELLI CEMETERY

Llanelli Town Council jointly owns Box Cemetery with Llanelli Rural Council and through this partnership and our role on the Llanelli Joint Burial Advisory Committee continue to fund the cemetery.

COMMUNITY SUPPORT

The Council owns and manages seven community centres providing subsidised facilities for use by the public of all ages. Additionally, it advises and assists community groups on a wide range of issues and provides grants and sponsorship to support the work of many local clubs, societies and organisations. Our Community Development Officer continues to work with many organisations delivering projects such as Unloved Heritage, Our Town and Dementia Friendly Communities.

FOOTPATHS AND LIGHTING

The Town Council continues to inspect and trash the town's public footpaths on behalf of the County Council and will be undertaking a programme of improvements to some of the pathways. The council also funds the energy and maintenance costs of the street lighting on these pathways.

CIVIC, DEMOCRATIC AND ADMIN

These are the costs of managing Council facilities and activities within the Community along with Council committees and the mayoralty.

CULTURAL AND HERITAGE

Llanelli Town Council owns Llanelly House which it has leased to CHRT on a long lease. The Town Council and the County Council continue to support the House to ensure that the Grade I listed building is maintained to the high standards already being set enabling it to be a significant asset to the town centre and its visitors.
