Economic regeneration is noted as being at the heart of the project vision, with all stakeholder partners driven to improve economic and social well-being through good quality, sustainable job creation; nurturing a skilled and ambitious workforce; supporting business development and advancing an integrated health and wellness facility.

- (4) That applicants be divided into the following five categories:
  - (i) an individual or groups comprising between two and four persons;
  - (ii) groups comprising between five and ten persons;
  - (iii) groups comprising between eleven and twenty-five persons;
  - (iv) groups comprising between twenty-six and fifty persons;
  - (v) groups comprising fifty-one persons and over.

- (5) By way of guidance only, that the following maxima be applied to the categories set out in (4):

Category 1 - £250;  
Category 2 - £500;  
Category 3 - £750;  
Category 4 - £1,000;  
Category 5 - £2,000.
