2 Principal Activities of the Council

Working in Partnership

The Town Council undertakes a joint scheme with Llanelli Rural Council at the Llanelli Joint Burial Authority (Llanelli Box Cemetery and Crematorium).

The Council also funds the Christmas Carnival through a tri-partite agreement with Llanelli Rural Council and Carmarthenshire County Council and with the assistance of the County Council organises the Remembrance Day Service at the Cenotaph. The Council also part-funds a rugby development officer to help develop local youngsters' skills.

Leisure and Recreation

The Town Council, on behalf of Carmarthenshire County Council, undertakes a regular maintenance programme of the footpath network within its area and provides an opportunity for four young people to participate in the Sail Training Association voyages. The Council continues to fund two paddling pools in its area through a service level agreement with Carmarthenshire County Council.

Community Centres

The Town Council currently owns and operates seven community centres.

The centres are spread throughout the Council's administrative area and accept in excess of 3,000 hirings a year from all types of organisations.

Stebonheath Park

The council owned Stebonheath Park football stadium continues to host Llanelli Town A.F.C. and Llanelli Raiders R.F.L. home matches and continues to support CCTA matches and local football finals.

Selwyn Samuel Centre

This Council owned facility is a six rink indoor bowling centre run by the Llanelli Indoor Bowls Club from September through to April of each year. During the summer months a temporary boarded floor is laid and the main hall is let out for concerts etc. The centre's catering operation is run by a concessionaire under a five year contract and includes the attached banqueting suite for external hire.

Community Development

The Town Council provides help for the community to access funding pots for local projects through its full-time Project Development Officer. Also the Council makes annual grants to a wide range of local voluntary and charitable organisations.

Llanelly House

The Council purchased this Grade 1 Listed building in 1998 and having leased the property to C.H.R.T. the house has been restored to its former glory.

Llanelli Town Estate

The Llanelli Town Council comprising of all twenty elected councillors (for the time being) are trustees of the charity known as Llanelli Town Estate. An inclosure award dated 24th October, 1810 provides (inter alia) for income to be applied 'in improving the Town and Port of Llanelli'.
