PARKS PLAYING FIELDS AND COMMUNITY CENTRES

Further to minute 96 of the Committee meeting held on the 10th March 2025, the following provides an update on developments with the Town Council Parks, Playing Fields, Community Centres and properties.

1. Park Improvements - Play By Numbers Project

The Play By Numbers project was funded by the Carmarthenshire County Council Administered, UK Government SPF. This has seen mathematics play panels installed at the following play areas encouraging children to learn and play:

- **Clos yr Ysgol**
- **Crown Park**
- **Havelock Park**
- **Penyfan Park**
- **Peoples' Park**

2. Roller Shutter Maintenance

The annual maintenance inspection of roller shutters has been recently completed.

The shutter at Peoples' Park Changing Room was noted to be catching in the box housing and jamming. The shutter was therefore taken down and reinstalled with a cost of £400.00 plus VAT. The 2 manual override facilities needed to be replaced at Lakefield Community Centre at a cost of £80.00 plus VAT.

3. Community Centre Furniture Requirements

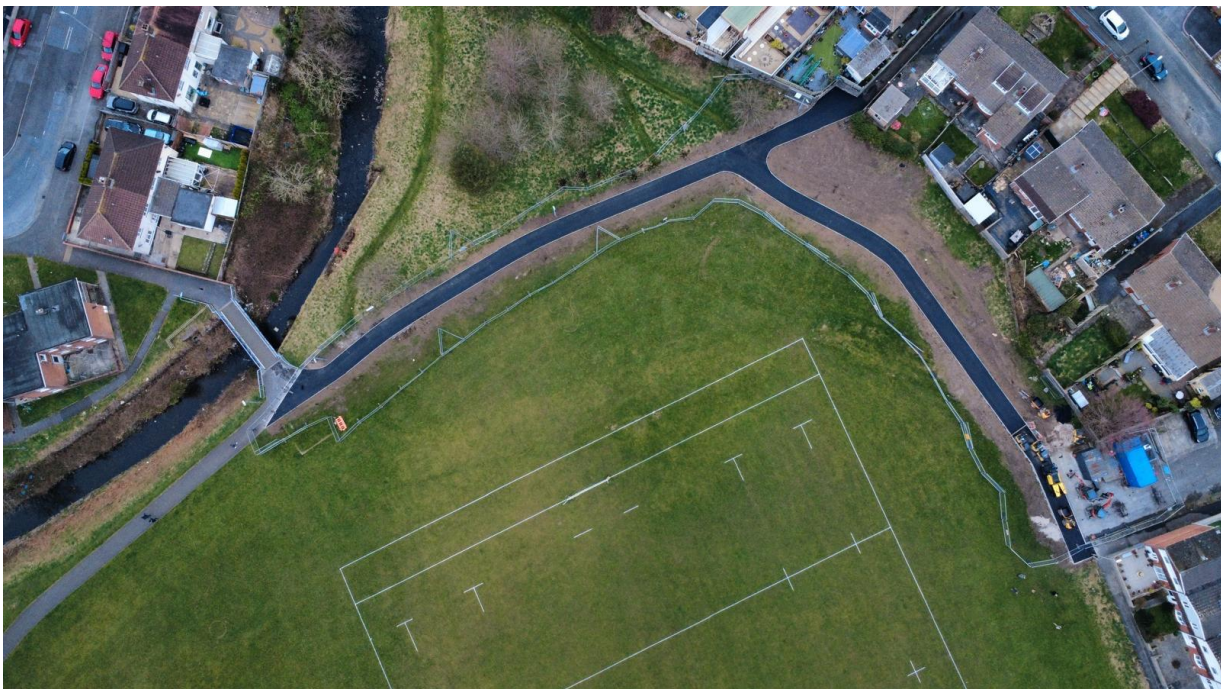
Following an audit of Community Centre Furniture, it has been identified that damaged tables need to be replaced at Glenalla Community Centre (4), Llanerch Community Centre (2) and Paddock Street (4). Prices have been sought for replacements (each) as follows:

- Go Pak - £111.83 excl VAT (1830mm x 610mm x 760mm)
- Viking - £154.00 excl VAT (1800mm x 800mm x 750mm)
- Furniture@Work - £122.00 excl VAT (1830mm x 690mm x 700mm)

It is therefore proposed to purchase the tables from Go Pak.

4. Footpath works at Penygaer Playing Fields

Work has been completed by Carmarthenshire County Council on the footpath improvements at Penygaer Playing Fields. 'Before and after' photos are included below.



5. **Morfa Park, Bwlch**

Further vandalism has been experienced with damage caused to the rubber surfacing in the park. This will be monitored as to whether it reaches the stage where the swing units will again need to be removed for a period.

DEFIBRILLATOR PROVISION

Further to minute 106 of the Committee meeting held on the 6th March 2023, an audit has been undertaken of the Llanelli Town Council maintained defibrillator provision.

These are all registered with the Ambulance Service *the circuit* website with regular checks carried out of their operation by the Town Council Park Keepers. In recent times the units at Crown Park and the Selwyn Samuel Centre have been used in emergency situations.

The Town Council has also arranged Defibrillator Awareness Training at Community Centres and the Old Vicarage in order to provide opportunities for Town Councillors, Staff Members and the general public to understand the use of these lifesaving pieces of equipment.

Ongoing Maintenance

Defibrillators require ongoing maintenance such as the periodic purchase of new batteries and replacement pads. In addition, when an unit is used in an emergency situation, the Ambulance Service will provide replacement pads (for Zoll Units). Defibrillators themselves have an average life span of 7-8 years.

Supplies for the units cost around:

	Pads	Batteries
• Mediana	£60 - £80	£170 - £200
• Zoll AED	£40 - £50	£40 - £50

The purchase of a Zoll AED Plus with lockable cabinet costs around £1,400 plus VAT. There would be an additional cost for connecting the cabinet to an electrical supply should a heated cabinet be preferred. While companies will advise to purchase such a cabinet, it is understood that this is not a necessity.

Heartbeat Trust

Meetings have been held with the Heartbeat Trust who have undertaken a project with Swansea City Council in relation to their defibrillator provision. They are a registered charity that will provide a maintenance service for defibrillators at a cost of £50.00 per unit per annum. This includes up to 4 changes of batteries and pads over a 7 year period. They will also monitor the units and advise on their condition. They also are ‘partnered’ with Zoll.

Wales Ambulance Service Trust

Meetings have also been held with the Wales Ambulance Service Trust to try to ascertain where there are gaps in provision across Llanelli. It is also noted that there are numerous units across the Town which are not appropriately maintained, leading to them being noted as not available by the Ambulance Service in emergency situations.

Unfortunately the information sought on where emergencies have taken place and where it was felt that additional provision was required in Llanelli has not been forthcoming to date.

Future provision and maintenance

Members will recall that a £20,000 budget has been included in the 2025-26 Town Council budget for Equipment Purchases (to include Defibrillators and EV Charging infrastructure). Utilising this budget, the Town Council should give consideration to a rolling programme of replacement of the units held by the Council with grants sought for new units proposed wherever possible. If this funding does not become available, the Town Council should make purchases to ensure that the units held continue to be useful in emergency situations in the Community.

Proposed Replacement Programme

A programme of replacement / renewal is proposed as follows:

Unit	Financial Year
Selwyn Samuel Centre	2025 - 2026
Penygaer Playing Fields	2025 - 2026
Old Vicarage	2026 – 2027
Stebonheath Park	2026 – 2027
Crown Park	2027 – 2028 (sooner if grants are available to change to a Zoll unit)
Parc Howard	2027 – 2028 (sooner if grants are available to change to a Zoll unit)
Penyfan Park	2030 - 2031

Further provision

Future additional provision has also been considered in order to widen the defibrillator availability at Town Council facilities and provide coverage in area of low numbers of nearby units. With consideration as follows:

- Havelock Park / Wesleyan Community Centre – Not currently required due to nearby unit availability.
- Paddock Street / Lakefield Community Centre – Not currently required due to nearby unit availability.

- Clos yr Ysgol / Glenalla Community Centre / Stebonheath Park – The unit at Stebonheath Park is held within the Stadium and is therefore not accessible 24 hours. It is proposed to provide an unit at one of these Town Council facilities to improve coverage in the area. Glenalla Community Centre would appear to be most appropriate, however it is likely that a listed building consent application would need to be submitted for the property.
- Llanerch Community Centre – Not currently required due to nearby unit availability.
- Nightingale Court Play Area - It is proposed to provide an unit in and around this Town Council facility to improve coverage in the area.
- Peoples' Park - Not currently required due to nearby unit availability.
- Parc Howard – The current unit is located on the Parc Howard Bowling Pavillion and is therefore not accessible 24 hours. Discussions could be held via the Parc Howard Collaboration Group in relation to possible provision on the external fence of Parc Howard (a proposal which would also require a listed building consent application).

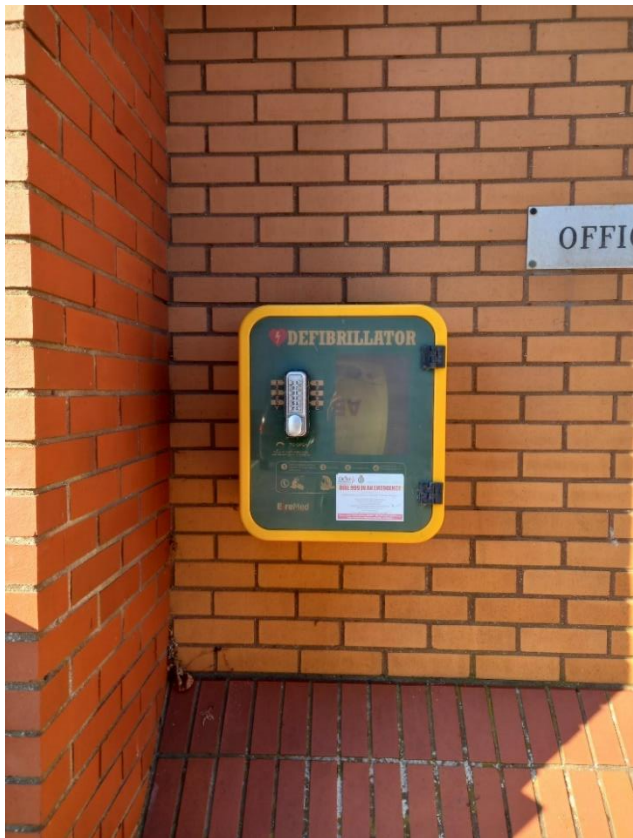

GRANT GUIDELINES

- (1) Applications should be accompanied by financial information (latest audited financial accounts and / or bank statement);
- (2) Applications should be accompanied by a clear description of how any award will be utilised;
- (3) Grants are not awarded to individuals;
- (4) Organisations will not normally be awarded more than one grant in any financial year;
- (5) The guideline amount for the following categories will be £300: Other interest groups, Schools and Playgroups, Local support groups, National Bodies – local branch, Fundraising groups, Religious organisations, Armed Forces and Veterans groups;
- (6) Community / Residents / Youth Groups; the guideline amount for organisations in this category will be £300;
 - a. Consideration can however be given of an award of up to £500 where the organisation can provide evidence that it is providing activities which are made available to and benefit the wider Community;
 - b. Consideration can however be given of an award of up to £500 where the organisation can provide evidence that it is providing services or activities which benefit under represented groups;
- (7) The guideline amount for Performing Arts groups will be £500;
- (8) The guideline amount for Sports clubs without an additional section (e.g. Junior Section, Senior Section, Women's Section, LGBT Section) will be £500;
- (9) The guideline amount for Sports clubs with an additional section; (e.g. Junior Section, Senior Section, Women's Section, LGBT Section) will be £800;
- (10) Applications from National Bodies will normally be noted;
- (11) Senior Citizens' groups will normally be granted free use of the Town Council's community halls;
- (12) The guideline amounts will normally be awarded for normal running costs, if an organisation is planning a specific project it is encouraged to provide information, including costs, relating to that project;
- (13) Group affiliated to the same umbrella body can apply for funding if they are based at different locations and have separate bank accounts;
- (14) These guidelines apply to applications for grants and do not apply to sponsorship agreements agreed by the Town Council.

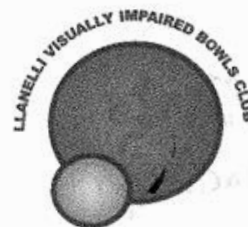
We also run a WAND Home education group and use Brynteg Farm as a forest school once a week as well as local history walks

Day Commemorations in Llanelli and we have close connections with Royal Naval Association and Royal British Legion.

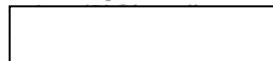
Most of our members have found active employment in the transport, logistics and security industries and our children are in the education system many having graduated and are now in the health and legal professions.

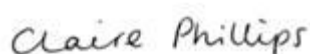
