PARKS PLAYING FIELDS AND COMMUNITY CENTRES

Further to minute 107 of the Committee meeting held on the 7th April 2025, the following provides an update on developments with the Town Council Parks, Playing Fields, Community Centres and properties.

1. Cruyff Court Penyfan

Following damage to the goal mouths, replacements have been supplied by the contractor. These will now be closely monitored due to having already been replaced on two occasions. Alternative provision may be required should the issue re-occur.

2. Penyfan Park Splash Pad

Further to Minute 92 of the Committee meeting held on the 17th February 2025. A leak was discovered in the water piping leading to the Penyfan Splash Pad. An emergency repair was requested therefore by the building contractor most recently involved with the splash pad, Martin Taffetsauffer Building Contractors. The cost including the need to involve an asbestos contractor was £3,001.99.

3. Havelock Park Splash Pad

Further to Minute 120 of the Committee meeting held on the 23rd April 2025. The splash pad at Havelock Park was brought into operation on the 17th May 2025. The final cost for the repair was £2,903.40, lower than the £5,690.00 quoted as replacement of a number of the suggested parts was not ultimately necessary.

4. Wesleyan Community Centre

Following a roof leak into the main Community Centre Hall, CBD Roofing were asked to assess possible repairs. Their quote of £1,005.45 was approved for progression. If further issues arise on closer inspection of the roof, a further report will be provided to the Committee.

5. EV Charging Provision

Meetings have been undertaken in order to prepare a tender document for provision of EV charging points at the following Town Council Facilities:

- Crown Park
- Old Vicarage
- Stebonheath Park
- Penyfan Park / Bigyn Community Centre

Further details will follow.

6. LED Lighting Upgrades

Meetings have been undertaken to begin consideration of a possible project to upgrade Town Council facility lighting units to LED, in order to seek to decrease energy usage. The first properties to be considered are suggested as Wesleyan Community Centre and the Old Vicarage. Further details will follow.

We do not believe that the whole of the front elevation required re painting at this time but would recommend a partial repaint to the areas shown below.

This will include 2 wall surfaces , all front elevation cills and front elevation plinth.

GRANT GUIDELINES

- (1) Applications should be accompanied by financial information (latest audited financial accounts and / or bank statement);
- (2) Applications should be accompanied by a clear description of how any award will be utilised;
- (3) Grants are not awarded to individuals;
- (4) Organisations will not normally be awarded more than one grant in any financial year;
- (5) The guideline amount for the following categories will be £300: Other interest groups, Schools and Playgroups, Local support groups, National Bodies – local branch, Fundraising groups, Religious organisations, Armed Forces and Veterans groups;
- (6) Community / Residents / Youth Groups; the guideline amount for organisations in this category will be £300;
 - a. Consideration can however be given of an award of up to £500 where the organisation can provide evidence that it is providing activities which are made available to and benefit the wider Community;
 - b. Consideration can however be given of an award of up to £500 where the organisation can provide evidence that it is providing services or activities which benefit under represented groups;
- (7) The guideline amount for Performing Arts groups will be £500;
- (8) The guideline amount for Sports clubs without an additional section (e.g. Junior Section, Senior Section, Women's Section, LGBT Section) will be £500;
- (9) The guideline amount for Sports clubs with an additional section; (e.g. Junior Section, Senior Section, Women's Section, LGBT Section) will be £800;
- (10) Applications from National Bodies will normally be noted;
- (11) Senior Citizens' groups will normally be granted free use of the Town Council's community halls;
- (12) The guideline amounts will normally be awarded for normal running costs, if an organisation is planning a specific project it is encouraged to provide information, including costs, relating to that project;
- (13) Group affiliated to the same umbrella body can apply for funding if they are based at different locations and have separate bank accounts;
- (14) These guidelines apply to applications for grants and do not apply to sponsorship agreements agreed by the Town Council.

Hi Sophia,

Iust to introduce a bit about the club, we are Llanelli Sub Aqua Club (LSAC) formed in 1962, currently with 13 members, 5 of whom are trainees going through the process of being educated to Ocean Diver Level, thanks to your grant from last year, we now have an extra 3 assistant instructors to help with this process and have attracted many try dives with 3 new members now being trained.

We are a BSAC (British Sub Aqua Club) affiliated club, with all members being part of this organisation too, so that they are covered by insurance and have credible qualifications awarded to them when they pass as divers, recognised worldwide.

We meet every Saturday at the Llanelli Leisure Centre at 4:30 – 5:30pm for training, try dives for anyone interested in starting scuba diving and a general catch up among members. We have a unit based in Llanelli which we rent from the Council to keep our training kit, air compressors and boat.

Each member pays an annual fee of £150 to join the club and this covers the pool session charges, maintenance to the boat and compressors and also annual servicing of the dive kit we use for training.

We are now faced with a serious maintenance issue which is affecting our operation as a club. The boat, engine and trailer are over 20 yrs old and while we have kept them all maintained, we believe that the trailer and engine are in need of replacing as a reliability and safety issue. The boat, locally made by Avon at the time of purchase, is however in great condition and we would like this to remain in the club and of course reduce the investment required. Items like engines and trailers come at a cost, we are aiming to raise around £13,000 to cover this.

Anything you can do to help us of course, would be greatly appreciated, please see this month's bank statement attached as requested.

On behalf of the students, their parents and teachers of the Polish School in Llanelli "Little Eagles" I kindly ask for financial support for our school.

Our school has been operating for 6 years and is the only Polish school in Carmarthenshire. We are developing. Last year, the youngest group "Llanelli Dragon Toddlers" was established. In total, we have 36 students in 3 groups, 2 teachers and 3 volunteer assistants. Classes are held on Saturdays and Sundays in Felinfoel and Dafen.

I am very happy that our children have the opportunity to learn their native language and that they have contact with Polish cultural heritage and Polish traditions. It is very important for children to be aware of their national identity and be proud of their country of origin. I am happy that our students are doing very well in local Welsh schools. They gain diplomas, participate in competitions and contests. They even write poems and recite them in Welsh!

The Polish school is very important for the Polish community, which is the largest national minority in Llanelli. Together with the parents of students and friends of the school, we celebrate Polish holidays, organize school events and integrate with the residents of Llanelli. We are also grateful that we are welcome here. Our bilingual students are invited to town events, during which they sing songs in Polish and English and parents prepare refreshments.

Our mission is to bring the joy of musical theatre to our local community while raising funds for various charitable causes. To implement this event, we are seeking funding to cover several key aspects of the event:

- Venue Hire: Securing a suitable location to accommodate the expected number of attendees and activities.
- Supplies for Activities: Providing materials for the clothes swap (cleaning and preparing) and activities on the day.
- Leaflets and Promotional Materials: Designing and printing leaflets to promote the event widely within the community, ensuring maximum participation and awareness.

We believe that with the support of the Llanelli Town Council, we can continue to create memorable and impactful community events that not only supports the members of our community but also sets the stage for our future productions. Dear Sir / Madam

Golau Baptist Church was planted in Llanelli in September 2024, with a focus on engaging with the community and more predominantly providing provisions for non-church goers and youth.

As part of our Church work, we actively look to provide youth provisions, predominantly in the Glanymor area, but also walking distance for youth in Tyisha. Prior to the establishment of Golau Baptist Church, I was involved in running both indoor and outdoor youth clubs for my previous church, again in the Seaside / Glanymor area.

Our youth club runs every Sunday from 6pm to 7:15pm. During the autumn and winter months, we host the youth club indoors at World Horizons in North Dock, then during spring and summer we move the youth club predominantly outside and utilise Llanelli Town Council's Crown Park. Our indoor youth club provides table sport games, such as table tennis and pool, as well as other table games, such as table football and air hockey. We have occasionally utilised local sports facilities such as the leisure centre and the Selwyn Samuel centre. When we move outdoors, the youth club is more sports orientated. Due to adverse weather conditions, we do occasionally need to move the spring and summer youth club indoors.

In 2019, two Carmarthenshire wards (namely Tyshia and Glanymor) were included in the top 20 worst wards for childhood poverty in Wales. In the 2019 Welsh Index of Multiple Deprivation (WIMD) Tyisha were ranked 17th and Glanymor as 68th most deprived ward areas in Wales. Whilst we are based in Glanymor, Tyshia is also within walking distance of our youth provisions, and we believe we are providing a much-needed provision into the area. We work closely alongside the Glanymor County Councillor, Sean Rees, and we have engaged with Dylan Sion-Thomas (Sports, Youth, and Activity Officer for Llanelli Town Council).

All youths are welcome to attend the youth club, there is no requirement to be either a Christian or a member of our church. We do not charge for anyone to attend. All our youth leaders who assist with the youth club are DBS checked.

While the youth club is outdoors, we vary the games and sports we play, firstly to ensure youths don't get bored, and secondly as certain sports don't always appeal to everyone. We try to mix the sports every session, whilst also introducing them to new sports, or variations of sports, they may not have been exposed to before. We believe offering this approach is not only good for social engagement for the youths, it improves social inclusion, and also promotes health and wellbeing.

We also acknowledge the costs involved in youths attending local sports clubs, often this is a barrier to them joining and restricting out of school activities.

At present, all our equipment and games have been purchased using either our own money or were donated. We are seeking funding to purchase new outdoor sports equipment ready for the spring and summer youth club.

We would seek funding to purchase some of the following sports equipment which would improve the range of activities we can provide at the youth club:

- New Softball / Rounders set
- New Kwik Cricket set
- Sport Bibs
- Portable tennis / badminton net
- Youth tennis rackets
- Footballs (varying sizes to cater for different ages)
- Pop-up goals (used for football and hockey)
- Set of netballs (we currently have a standalone netball hoop)
- Ball pumps
- Cones (used for various sports)

Many thanks for the prompt reply to the email and for explaining the process for grant applications.

The application for grant funding from Llangennech Cricket Club is to support the costs of utilising the Crown Park, Seaside FC facility, which is within the boundaries of Llanelli Town Council.
