GRANT GUIDELINES

- (1) Applications should be accompanied by financial information (latest audited financial accounts and / or bank statement);
- (2) Applications should be accompanied by a clear description of how any award will be utilised;
- (3) Grants are not awarded to individuals;
- (4) Organisations will not normally be awarded more than one grant in any financial year;
- (5) The guideline amount for the following categories will be £300: Other interest groups, Schools and Playgroups, Local support groups, National Bodies – local branch, Fundraising groups, Religious organisations, Armed Forces and Veterans groups;
- (6) Community / Residents / Youth Groups; the guideline amount for organisations in this category will be £300;
- (7) Consideration can however be given of an award of up to £500 where the organisation can provide evidence that it is providing activities which are made available to and benefit the wider Community;
 - a. Consideration can however be given of an award of up to £500 where the organisation can provide evidence that it is providing services or activities which benefit under represented groups;
- (8) The guideline amount for Performing Arts groups will be £500;
- (9) The guideline amount for Sports clubs without an additional section (e.g. Junior Section, Senior Section, Women's Section, LGBT Section) will be £500;
- (10) The guideline amount for Sports clubs with an additional section; (e.g. Junior Section, Senior Section, Women's Section, LGBT Section) will be £800;
- (11) Applications from National Bodies will normally be noted;
- (12) Senior Citizens' groups will normally be granted free use of the Town Council's community halls;
- (13) The guideline amounts will normally be awarded for normal running costs, if an organisation is planning a specific project it is encouraged to provide information, including costs, relating to that project;
- (14) Group affiliated to the same umbrella body can apply for funding if they are based at different locations and have separate bank accounts;
- (15) These guidelines apply to applications for grants and do not apply to sponsorship agreements agreed by the Town Council.

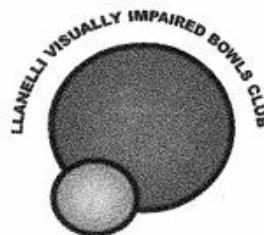

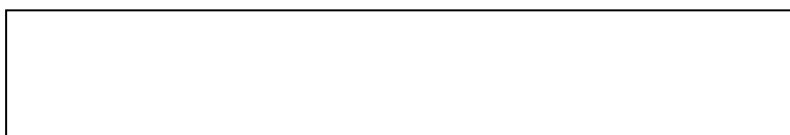

Llangollen International Musical Eisteddfod

Preparations are well underway for the **2026 Llangollen International Musical Eisteddfod**, and I am writing as part of our annual fundraising appeal to Local Authorities, Town and Community Councils.

Subject: Application for Financial Assistance Grant – Satori Jujitsu Community Programme

Dear Sir/Madam,

I am writing on behalf of Satori Jujitsu to apply for consideration under the council's Financial Assistance Grant Scheme. Satori Jujitsu is a not-for-profit community martial arts academy established in 2017, originally starting in a local school hall before growing into a permanent facility serving the local community. Today we have just over 300 active members, of which approximately 85% are children and young people.

Our core mission is to provide accessible, structured physical activity and personal development opportunities for children and families within the community.

We deliver age-appropriate classes from ages 3–4, 5–7, 8–11 through to adults, ensuring safe and progressive development at every stage. Our programmes focus not only on physical skills but also on confidence, discipline, respect, and personal responsibility. Members progress through a structured grading system, giving young people clear goals and a sense of achievement as they develop.

Alongside our academy classes, we actively support the local community by working with schools. We regularly provide free taster sessions within schools and run after-school programmes, helping children discover martial arts in a safe and supportive environment. Teachers and parents consistently provide positive feedback, noting improvements in confidence, behaviour, focus, and social interaction among the children who take part.

For many young people, Satori Jujitsu also becomes a place where they can make friends, stay active, learn self-defence, and develop life skills in a positive environment.

In addition to our community programmes, we have also developed a competitive pathway for young athletes in Wales. Through our work with Great Britain Jujitsu, we have helped establish a pathway that allows athletes to progress from club level to national and international competition.

This programme has already achieved remarkable success. Our academy has produced:

- The first JJIF Jujitsu World Champion from Wales and UK in 25 years
- The first JJEU European Champion in 25 years
- A team of 11 young athletes who have been selected to represent Great Britain internationally

While this programme provides incredible opportunities for young athletes, it is important to highlight that the pathway is currently unfunded. Travel, training, and competition costs place a significant financial burden on families. As a club, we actively organise fundraising initiatives to help support the squad and reduce these costs wherever possible, ensuring that talented young athletes are not excluded due to financial barriers.

We also place a strong emphasis on coach education and safeguarding. Our coaching team includes instructors trained to Level 2 coaching standards, and several lead coaches also hold Personal Training qualifications. All staff are appropriately trained and vetted to work with children, ensuring a safe, professional, and supportive environment for all participants.

Through these programmes, Satori Jujitsu plays an important role in:

- Encouraging physical activity and healthy lifestyles
- Supporting youth development and confidence building
- Providing positive community engagement
- Creating opportunities for young people to achieve at national and international levels

Financial assistance from the council would help us continue to grow these programmes, improve access for children across the community, and further support the development pathway we have created for young people in Wales.

We would be grateful for the opportunity to be considered for support under the council's Financial Assistance Grant scheme and would be happy to provide any additional information required.

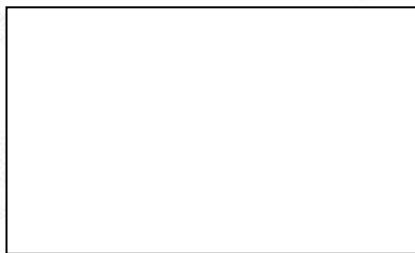

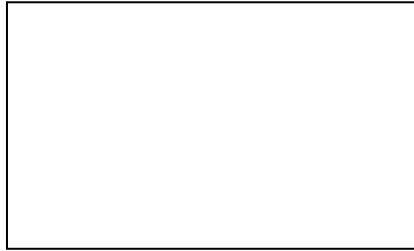

By far the biggest event we have in 2026 is the visit by the Agen under 15s rugby team in June.

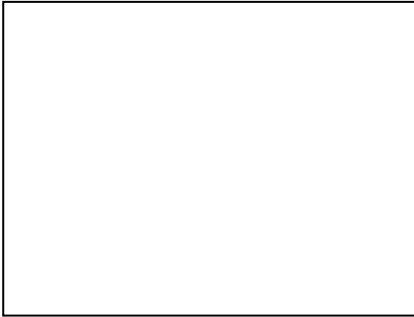
31 players and coaching staff will be here with us on the weekend of 19-21st June. There is a packed programme planned for them, including the game with our under15s on Saturday 20th.

I wish to apply for the annual Llanelli Town Council Grant, on behalf of LLAMA (LLANELLI AUTISM MAMS ASSOCIATION).

As you are aware, we hold many activities in the Llanelli area, for neurodivergent families. We now have over 1400 members, and are growing steadily with every passing year. These activities range from sporting activities, carer support and wellbeing services, to after school and breakfast clubs. One such after school club, we hold in the Wesleyan hall. It's important we hold these activities near to where our families live, because many do not drive and find using public transport an issue.

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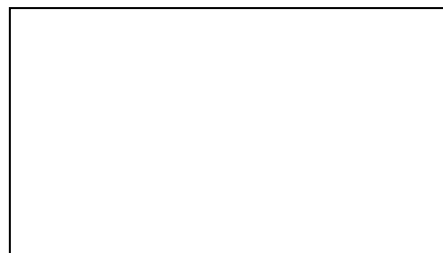

LLANELLI TOWN COUNCIL

ANNUAL INVESTMENT STRATEGY

This Annual Investment Strategy is prepared in accordance with the statutory guidance on Local Government Investments issued by the Welsh Government.

All cash, bank balances, financial assets, borrowings and credit arrangements are defined as a part of the Council's treasury management activities. This Annual Investment Strategy will concentrate on the Council's temporarily surplus resources (or other financial assets it holds) and the investments it undertakes of these resources.

The Council undertakes to ensure that for all its investments, priority will be given to security and liquidity rather than to yield. In drafting this Annual Investment Strategy the Council has made appropriate arrangements for:

- Identification, management and control of risks in the investments/treasury management activities it undertakes;
- Budgeting, accounting and audit arrangements;
- Its cash and cash flow management requirements;
- Segregation of responsibilities, organisational arrangements, adequate documentation and the identification of a responsible officer for investment/ treasury management activities;
- Corporate governance;
- Procedures to ensure it is alert to the possibility it may become subject to an attempt to involve it in a transaction involving the laundering of money.

All Investments undertaken by this Council will be made and repaid in Sterling.

SUMS TO BE INVESTED

The Responsible Financial Officer will have authorisation to invest any available cash balances with H.S.B.C. Investment Bank for a period of up to 12 months.

LISTING OF INVESTMENTS UNDERTAKEN

The Council will undertake the following categories of investment for the financial year 2026-27:

- Fixed cash deposits with H.S.B.C. Investment Bank sums to be deposited as per balances;
- Deposits in Interest Earning Accounts available at the Council's Bank to a maximum of £1,000,000.

NEW INVESTMENTS – REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

If any new investment instruments (other than those approved in the list above) are proposed during the financial year 2026-27 before such an investment is undertaken it will need to first be approved by the Building and Finance Committee
