PARKS PLAYING FIELDS AND COMMUNITY CENTRES

Further to minute 23 of the Committee meeting held on the 14th July 2025, the following provides an update on developments with the Town Council Parks, Playing Fields, Community Centres and properties.

1. Crown Park

a) Playing Field Fence

Works are ongoing with the installation of the pitch surround fence at Crown Park.

b) Storage Container

A date for removal of the container is awaited.

2. Peoples' Park

a) Leisure Centre and MUGA

Officers have held meetings with the County Council Leisure Team to discuss arrangements to be put in place when the Leisure Centre at Park Crescent is closed upon the opening of the Pentre Awel Centre. These discussion include the impact upon the Town Council facilities at Peoples' Park and the Selwyn Samuel Centre. A date is not yet confirmed for this closure.

Risk assessments and security arrangements for the current building are under consideration by the County Council.

In the meantime, when County Council staff transfer from site, it is proposed that in order to ensure the astroturf MUGA at Peoples' Park (currently managed by the Leisure Centre), remains available for public use, that the Town Council Park Keepers undertake daily inspection and litter picking of the facility. For the avoidance of doubt, it is not proposed for the facility to be transferred into Town Council management and the Council would not take on any responsibility for the maintenance of the facility.

b) Skate Park

Further fencing panels have been vandalised and removed from the facility. A full project to replace the fencing with more hard wearing panels will now be considered, with a further report to be provided to the Committee.

Following a further inspection, 6 skate unit surface panels are noted as requiring replacement. These have been ordered for delivery by Axo Leisure (the manufacturers of the skate park), with a cost of £2,579.00 plus VAT, including delivery.

GRANT GUIDELINES

- (1) Applications should be accompanied by financial information (latest audited financial accounts and / or bank statement);
- (2) Applications should be accompanied by a clear description of how any award will be utilised;
- (3) Grants are not awarded to individuals;
- (4) Organisations will not normally be awarded more than one grant in any financial year;
- (5) The guideline amount for the following categories will be £300: Other interest groups, Schools and Playgroups, Local support groups, National Bodies – local branch, Fundraising groups, Religious organisations, Armed Forces and Veterans groups;
- (6) Community / Residents / Youth Groups; the guideline amount for organisations in this category will be £300;
- (7) Consideration can however be given of an award of up to £500 where the organisation can provide evidence that it is providing activities which are made available to and benefit the wider Community;
 - a. Consideration can however be given of an award of up to £500 where the organisation can provide evidence that it is providing services or activities which benefit under represented groups;
- (8) The guideline amount for Performing Arts groups will be £500;
- (9) The guideline amount for Sports clubs without an additional section (e.g. Junior Section, Senior Section, Women's Section, LGBT Section) will be £500;
- (10) The guideline amount for Sports clubs with an additional section; (e.g. Junior Section, Senior Section, Women's Section, LGBT Section) will be £800;
- (11) Applications from National Bodies will normally be noted;
- (12) Senior Citizens' groups will normally be granted free use of the Town Council's community halls;
- (13) The guideline amounts will normally be awarded for normal running costs, if an organisation is planning a specific project it is encouraged to provide information, including costs, relating to that project;
- (14) Group affiliated to the same umbrella body can apply for funding if they are based at different locations and have separate bank accounts;
- (15) These guidelines apply to applications for grants and do not apply to sponsorship agreements agreed by the Town Council.

The outcomes to date have improved wellbeing as well as behaviour and allows cross learning throughout the school.

Furthermore, the children are able to **take home the food they create**, which encourages a sense of pride and achievement while also supporting healthy eating habits at home. We would love the opportunity to support Penygaer to expand this further. The school have demonstrated over several years their entrepreneurship of pupils at the Llanelli Young Trader events. We believe this funding would allow us as the PTA to build on this.

Our aim is to carry on working with Parc Howard Association and volunteers in the community as well as parents to look at establishing a 'Box Bwyd' approach. This would mean the children would grow some of the resources in the school to cook in the wellbeing session. With hopefully in time creating recipes with some of the key fresh ingredients being purchased through the school.

The much-needed additional funding, would allow as the PTA to enhance our resources, provide better equipment, and ensure that every child has access to high-quality materials and experiences. This financial support would also help us sustain

Please accept this application for a Llanelli Town Council Grant for the financial period 1.4.2025 to 31.3.2026. I can see from our records that we last applied for the grant in September 2023, so we have missed the financial year 1.4.2024 - 31.3.2025. If it is possible to claim retrospectively for that period then we would be most grateful if you could include that. However, if that is not possible then we completely understand.

The application is in respect of The Rose Garden Project situated in the Elli Ward, adjacent to 63 New Road, Llanelli.

The purpose of our group is to enhance and maintain the plot of land at the corner of Stradey Park Avenue and New Road, Llanelli, commonly known as 'The Rose Garden'. To work in partnership with other residents' groups in the area, Councils, local residents, other organisations and other bodies to improve the area.

We have been able to provide a Christmas 2024 and VE Day Afternoon Tea events free of charge for all from current funds, but are facing considerable expense in the future once the works to complete the fallen garden wall are complete. Our aim is to finally properly landscape and plant up the adjacent bed to the wall, and also finally prepare a small area for our water supply tank and a small weatherproof and lockable storage shed. We are also hoping to provide another Christmas event, and possibly something to mark the reopening of the garden, although they may turn out to be the same date!

The Association of Polish Journalists and Writers in Wales, known as Dialog, has been actively fostering Polish-Welsh cooperation for many years. We promote shared cultural values, traditions, and achievements in the fields of science and art. Our activities are conducted on a pro bono basis, meaning that no individuals, including project managers, receive any financial compensation. We focus on educating children, youth, and adults about Polish history, language, geography, and art, all enriched by our experiences of life in Wales.

Our headquarters are located in Llanelli, Carmarthenshire, where we collaborate closely with local institutions such as People Speak Up, Razem Polish Community, the Town Council, the Rural Council, Carmarthenshire County Council, and Railway Goods Shed. Through our efforts, we not only represent the Polish community on national and international stages but also enhance the image of Llanelli—our new home—as a vibrant and positive voice within South Wales, including in the Welsh Parliament. We take pride in this recognition.

Since 2010, we have published Dialog Magazine, a bilingual periodical dedicated to the Polish community in Carmarthenshire and increasingly throughout Wales. In 2023, we launched the Young Journalists Academy, which allows participants aged 8–18 to represent the Polish diaspora internationally. They have delivered heartfelt speeches and hosted the Polish Heritage Days event in the Senedd in Cardiff.

Our organization blends education for the Polish diaspora with journalistic activities, cultural promotion, and historical documentation. We bridge tradition with the present. Additionally, we operate a community

library and archive to support the development and integration of Polish communities in Wales. We are also committed to assisting veterans and elderly individuals facing loneliness.

We are proud to have published the first anthology of Polish poetry in Wales, titled "Whispers in the Rain," and to have co-organized nearly every major Polish diaspora event of international significance in the UK, including:

- Polish Heritage Days (Llanelli since 2022; Senedd 2022 and 2024)
- Fundraising and unveiling of a memorial plaque honoring Polish pilots in Carmarthenshire (2024)
- Premiere of the "Whispers in the Rain" anthology (2024)
- Participation in VE Day commemorations in the Senedd (2025), where our chairperson, Agnieszka Raduj-Turko, delivered a speech highlighting the contributions of Polish pilots to the fight for freedom during WWII.

For the past 18 years, we have proudly documented and published information about the 316 Warsaw Polish Fighter Squadron, which was formed in Pembrey, Wales, in 1941.

A full record of our initiatives is available on our blog and Facebook pages.

In light of our continued commitment, we respectfully request financial support of up to £500. This funding would enable us to further our mission and continue promoting Llanelli at Welsh, British, and international levels.

Tea, Talk & Time is a new initiative by Shadows Depression Support Group Ltd, designed to provide confidential, trauma-informed spaces where individuals can gather, connect, and access meaningful support. Rooted in warmth and simplicity, each session creates an environment where participants are free to talk, listen, or simply be — reducing isolation and making space for emotional safety.

This initiative specifically supports those experiencing:

Social isolation and loneliness

Mild to moderate mental health challenges

Life stressors, grief, or anxiety

Barriers to accessing traditional services

At the heart of the project is a belief that community is a powerful antidote to emotional hardship. I am Jane Jones, coordinator of Needles, Pins & Crafty Things Community Group. We now meet at The Samuel Centre café, Rear of Leisure Centre, Parc Crescent, Llanelli, on Wednesdays.

As you are probably aware we do the outside post box toppers throughout Llanelli Area, also displays at churches, poppy displays, including Town Hall.

We also make items for the Peony Ward Breast Cancer unit, along with Trauma bears for the local fire and ambulance service.

We are proud to have been asked by Parc Howard association and Parc Howard museum if we could do some displays for them, and for the public to enjoy. This will be something new for us, and we are excited to be involved in this with the volunteers. We have agreed to do this, starting early 2026. We are also doing displays at North dock, and hoping to expand our displays there next year.

We have also been asked to do more church displays this year.

We don't charge the ladies to come to group, and where ever possible we use donated items from the community. We try to recycle and use many items again, wherever possible, but due to the weather, some cannot be used.

The ladies give their time freely to make the displays, so we don't think it's appropriate to charge them to come to the group.
