52. MEMBERS' DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

No declarations of interest were made.

53. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

The Town Mayor (Councillor B.A.L. Roberts) noted that no members of the public were in attendance at this meeting.

54. LLANELLI DRUG & ALCOHOL PUBLIC SPACES PROTECTION ORDER / NORTH DOCK, LLANELLI: VEHICLE PUBLIC SPACES PROTECTION ORDER

The Town Mayor (Councillor B.A.L. Roberts) welcomed representatives of Carmarthenshire County Council and Dyfed Powys Police to the meeting. The representatives provided presentations on the two proposed Public Spaces Protection Orders that were currently under consultation as follows:

a) Llanelli: Drug & Alcohol Public Spaces Protection Order

It was noted that the currently operating order was proposed for renewal in January 2027 with consideration being given to introducing new dispersal powers as part of the new order.

The order would be introduced by Carmarthenshire County Council and enforced by Dyfed Powys Police.

b) North Dock, Llanelli: Vehicle Public Spaces Protection Order

It was noted that consultation was being undertaken on the possible introduction of a PSPO in January 2027 with regards to vehicle related antisocial behaviour with powers in relation to vehicle gathering and related nuisance in the North Dock area.

The order would again be introduced by Carmarthenshire County Council and enforced by Dyfed Powys Police.

Following the presentation members were given the opportunity to ask questions of the representatives. Following which, the Town Mayor (Councillor B.A.L. Roberts) thanked them for their attendance and they then left the meeting.

Thereafter, the Town Council gave consideration to the Consultation, where it was:

RESOLVED – that the Town Council supports in principal the two proposed Public Spaces Protection Orders and urges continuing detailed consultation on the proposals with residents and businesses in the Community.
