MEETING – JUNE 2026

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AND ACTIVITIES REPORT

The Town Council has a legal duty under the Well-being of Future Generations Act 2015 to ensure it takes consideration of the Act in all its activities and services. The Town Council Community Development Service supports the delivery of the objectives set out within both the Act and the Carmarthenshire Well-being strategy through its work in Llanelli with Community Organisations and key partners for 2026 / 27.



(1) Community Activities

- **Healing the Divide – “More in Common” Partnership** - The Inclusive “More in Common” Partnership in Llanelli builds on earlier training delivered in the year in collaboration with Healing the Divide, aiming to strengthen community understanding and connection. The initiative brings together local partners to foster inclusion, resilience, and dialogue across diverse groups in the town. With a planned launch on 19th June in Llanelli Town Centre, the project marks an important step toward creating a more united community. The partnership is working closely with the Jo Cox Foundation, whose values are to bringing people together and celebrating common ground. Further information to follow.
- **Junior Young Traders 2026** – 12 local Llanelli-based schools participated in the initiative at Llanelli Town Market on the 14th May, where pupils operated stalls to buy, sell, and gain first-hand experience of working within a live market environment. The project proved highly successful, with total sales exceeding £5,000 across all participating schools. Ysgol Penygarn was awarded the prize for Best Presented Stall, while Ysgol Ffwrnes received the award for Highest Profit, recognising the pupils’ creativity, organisation, and entrepreneurial skills throughout the event.

- **Disability Football Festival** - 16 teams from across South Wales visited Stebonheath Park on a sunny day on the 17th May to take part in a non-competitive football festival. The event promoted participation, enjoyment, and community engagement through sport. TATA Steel generously sponsored the festival, ensuring that every participant received a commemorative medal in recognition of their involvement and contribution to the successful event.
- **Twin Cities Rugby Exchange** - On 19th June, Llanelli will welcome 31 youth team players and coaches from professional side S.U. Agen, representing our twin town relationship. The visiting group will receive a warm welcome to Llanelli, with Town Council officers supporting the Llanelli & District Twinning Association in showcasing the town in the best possible light. It is hoped that the visit will strengthen cultural and sporting links between the two communities. As part of the programme, renowned referee Nigel Owens will officiate the match which will take place on 20th June at 2.00pm at Furnace RFC.
- **Transforming Tyshia Spring Clean Event** - The Town Council has been supporting a litter-picking initiative led by the Transforming Tyisha Team in partnership with Ysgol Bigyn and Ysgol Penrhos. Through the project, pupils have completed a series of litter picks while also identifying and analysing the types of waste found across Llanelli, helping to raise environmental awareness and encourage community responsibility from a young age.
- **Cooking with Cancer** - The Town Council is working in partnership with the Angor Cancer and Long-Term Illness Charity and Gegin Y Bobl to support individuals living with long-term illnesses and cancer-related conditions. A consultation event will take place at the Antioch Centre on 15th June, providing participants with the opportunity to share their views on the types of support, activities, and recipes they would like to cook with. The project will also see exercise as a key component to supporting those with life term illness.
- **Cegin y Bobl** – A request has been received for the Town Council to provide a letter of support for a grant application being made by Cegin y Bobl to deliver their early years courses for families with young children. These are noted to be 2-hour long cookery courses taught over 3 weeks which bring new mums/dads together to learn about nutrition, weaning and tips to integrate more healthy foods into their diet. The courses act as a safe, supportive group environment to provide peer support. It is recommended that the Town Council provide a letter of support.

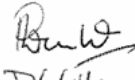

Adoption of Fair Work Wales Principles

In recent years, significant community facilities have been transferred to Llanelli Town Council as part of asset-transfer arrangements initiated by Carmarthenshire County Council. As a result of these transfers, the Town Council now directly employs a larger workforce than at any previous point in its history. Given this expansion in staffing responsibilities, it is timely and appropriate for the Council to strengthen, modernise, and formalise its employment-related policies to ensure that all staff are treated fairly, consistently, and in line with best practice across Wales. The Welsh Government's *Fair Work Wales* framework provides a clear set of principles designed to promote fair reward, security, equality, worker voice, and strong employment standards. Adopting these principles will support the Council in delivering high-quality employment practices and in ensuring that its growing workforce is supported, valued, and represented.

Council Resolves To:

1. Adopt the Fair Work Wales Principles

Llanelli Town Council formally adopts the *Fair Work Wales* Principles and commits to embedding them within all areas of its employment practice, policy development, and organisational culture.

2. Strengthen Worker Voice and Trade Union Recognition

To ensure that staff are able to access meaningful representation and collective support, the Council commits to:

- Recognising relevant trade unions** representing Town Council employees.
- Ensuring staff have access to **independent trade union advice and representation**.
- Supporting **collective bargaining arrangements**, where these apply.
- Facilitating reasonable paid time for trade union duties and training in accordance with statutory requirements.

3. Promote Fair and Transparent Employment Practices

The Council will:

- Maintain or exceed the **Real Living Wage** for all directly employed staff.
- Review the use of **temporary or insecure contracts**, minimising reliance on them wherever possible.
- Provide clear pathways for training, progression, and continuous professional development.
- Ensure workplace policies reflect the principles of equality, inclusivity, and fair treatment.

4. Integrate Fair Work Principles into Procurement and Commissioning

When awarding or renewing contracts, the Council will:

- Request information from suppliers on how they uphold fair employment practices.
- Encourage contractors to recognise trade unions and support employee representation.
- Consider Fair Work commitments as part of evaluation criteria, within procurement law.

5. Produce a Fair Work Implementation Report

The Town Clerk will bring a report to Council within six months outlining:

- What steps are required to embed Fair Work Wales Principles across the organisation.
- Current areas of good practice.
- Areas for improvement.
- Recommended actions and timelines.

6. Publish an Annual Fair Work Update

An annual report will be brought to Full Council, summarising progress and ensuring ongoing oversight of the Council's Fair Work commitments.

Motion: Review of Cooking Facilities at Community Centres

This Council notes the ongoing decline in usage across several community centres and the increasing competition from alternative venues offering more versatile amenities. Council further recognises the importance that food-related activities play in community life, from social clubs to cultural events and family gatherings.

In order to understand how our facilities can better support local groups and encourage increased usage, **this Council resolves:**

1. **To undertake a light-touch review of the cooking and food-preparation facilities available across all Llanelli Town Council community centres**, identifying any opportunities for improved consistency, communication, or low-cost enhancements that could encourage greater community use.
2. **That this review shall be carried out within existing officer resources, and does not commit the Council to any expenditure** at this stage.
3. **That the review may form part of existing work on community centre usage**, and shall not require a standalone report unless officers deem it necessary.
4. **That the findings and any options arising will be reported back to the Building and Finance Committee within three months**, for members to consider as part of ongoing work to strengthen community centre usage.

This motion does not direct officers toward any fixed outcome. Instead, it seeks information that will enable the Council to make informed decisions and support the long-term success of its community centres.

NOTICE OF MOTION

Dedicated School Nurse for Ysgol Heol Goffa

BACKGROUND

Ysgol Heol Goffa is a maintained special school in Llanelli serving children and young people aged 3 to 19 with severe learning difficulties or profound and multiple learning difficulties. Many pupils have complex, life-limiting medical conditions requiring clinical support throughout the school day. The school currently has 132 pupils on roll against a capacity of 118.

The school does not have a dedicated, full-time registered nurse on site. Teaching staff and teaching assistants are carrying out medical procedures including tube feeding, seizure monitoring and medication administration. While the dedication of staff is not in question, these are clinical responsibilities they are not registered to perform, and the situation places both pupils and staff in a difficult and potentially unsafe position.

The headteacher has been requesting a full-time nurse for five years. Carmarthenshire County Council has been raising the matter with Hywel Dda University Health Board for several years without resolution. Dame Nia Griffith MP has described the situation as deeply concerning, noting that comparable special schools elsewhere in Wales have dedicated nursing provision in place.

Estyn's inspection report of January 2026 explicitly noted the absence of a dedicated school nurse as an area requiring improvement. The Children's Commissioner for Wales, Rocio Cifuentes MBE, has since written to Hywel Dda University Health Board to raise the issue and seek a meeting, stating that children with complex and life-limiting medical needs have the right to feel safe and properly supported in school.

THE NEW SCHOOL

This Council welcomes the recently announced timescale for a new school building. Details confirmed at the Education and Young People Scrutiny Committee on 12 May 2026 show that the new 150-pupil school, to be sited near Ysgol Pen Rhos, is planned to open in September 2029, subject to Welsh Government approval.

After years of delays, cancellations and uncertainty, this commitment is genuinely welcome. But a 2029 opening does not help the children who are in school today. The nursing issue is urgent and must be resolved in its own right, not treated as something that can wait until the new building is ready.

MOTION

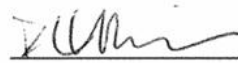
This Council resolves to write formally to Carmarthenshire County Council urging it to take all necessary steps to secure the immediate appointment of a dedicated, full-time registered school nurse for Ysgol Heol Goffa.

The letter should make clear that:

- Llanelli Town Council regards the current position as unacceptable and potentially unsafe for some of the most vulnerable children in the county.
- The recommendation made by Estyn in January 2026, the intervention of the Children's Commissioner for Wales, and the concerns raised by the local MP all require a clear and time-bound response from Hywel Dda University Health Board.
- A dedicated nurse must be seen as an immediate requirement, entirely separate from and not dependent on the new building programme.

This Council also requests that the Town Clerk write directly to the Chair of Hywel Dda University Health Board, copying in the local Members of the Senedd to express this Council's concern and to ask for a clear update on what the Health Board intends to do and when.
