Planning application – Basis for objection

- GP1 d.** It would not have a significant impact on the amenity of adjacent land uses, properties, residents or the community;

Policy H3 Conversion or Subdivision of Existing Dwellings - Proposals for the conversion or sub-division of appropriate dwellings into flats or dwellings of multiple occupation, will be permitted provided that:

- H3 a.** It would not result in an over-intensification of use;
- H3 b.** Suitable parking provision is available, or made available;
- H3 c.** The architectural quality, character and appearance of the building is, where applicable, safeguarded and its setting not unacceptably harmed.

Policy GP1 - Sustainability and High Quality Design

- GP1 d.** It would not have a significant impact on the amenity of adjacent land uses, properties, residents or the community;

Policy EP2 Pollution

- EP2 c.** Ensure that light and noise pollution are where appropriate minimised

Concern – Not in keeping with other properties / local area

Policy GP1 - Sustainability and High Quality Design

- GP1 a.** It conforms with and enhances the character and appearance of the site, building or area in terms of siting, appearance, scale, height, massing, elevation treatment, and detailing;
- GP1 c.** Utilises materials appropriate to the area within which it is located;
- GP1 f.** It retains, and where appropriate incorporates important local features (including buildings, amenity areas, spaces, trees, woodlands and hedgerows) and ensures the use of good quality hard and soft landscaping and embraces opportunities to enhance biodiversity and ecological connectivity;
- GP1 i.** It protects and enhances the landscape, townscape, historic and cultural heritage of the County and there are no adverse effects on the setting or integrity of the historic environment;

Policy GP6 Extensions

- GP6 b.** The external appearance of the proposed extension in terms of design is subordinate, and the materials should complement that of the existing development;
- GP6 c.** There are no adverse effects on the natural environment, landscape/townscape or the setting and integrity of the historic environment;

- H4 c.** The design and materials of the replacement dwelling are appropriate to the character and appearance of the area;
- H4 f.** There are no adverse effects on nature conservation interests, the setting or integrity of the historic environment and the landscape/ townscape;

- GP1 d.** It would not have a significant impact on the amenity of adjacent land uses, properties, residents or the community;
- GP1 h.** An appropriate access exists or can be provided which does not give rise to any parking or highway safety concerns on the site or within the locality;
- GP1 l.** It has regard for the safe, effective and efficient use of the transportation network;
- GP1 m.** It provides an integrated network which promotes the interests of pedestrians, cyclists and public transport which ensures ease of access for all;

Policy GP6 Extensions

- GP6 a.** The scale of the proposed extension is subordinate and compatible to the size, type and character of the existing development and does not result in over development of the site, nor lead to reduced and inadequate areas of parking, utility, vehicle turning, amenity or garden space;

Policy H4 Replacement Dwellings

- H4 e.** There are no adverse effects on access, parking or utility services, or on local amenity;

Concern – Blocks light of adjacent properties

Policy GP1 - Sustainability and High Quality Design

- GP1 d.** It would not have a significant impact on the amenity of adjacent land uses, properties, residents or the community;

Policy GP6 Extensions

- GP6 d.** The local environment and the amenities of neighbouring developments are not adversely affected by the proposed extension;

Concern – Possible Criminal Activity

Policy GP1 - Sustainability and High Quality Design

- GP1 d.** It would not have a significant impact on the amenity of adjacent land uses, properties, residents or the community;
- GP1 g.** It achieves and creates attractive, safe places and public spaces, which ensures security through the ‘designing-out-crime’ principles of Secured by Design (including providing natural surveillance, visibility, well lit environments and areas of public movement);

Concern – Water or other types of pollution

Policy GP1 - Sustainability and High Quality Design

- GP1 j.** It ensures or provides for, the satisfactory generation, treatment and disposal of both surface and foul water;
- GP1 k.** It has regard to the generation, treatment and disposal of waste.

Policy GP6 Extensions

- GP6 d.** The local environment and the amenities of neighbouring developments are not adversely affected by the proposed extension;

Policy EP1 Water Quality And Resources

Proposals for development will be permitted where they do not lead to a deterioration of either the water environment and/or the quality of controlled waters. Proposals will, where appropriate, be expected to contribute towards improvements to water quality.

Watercourses will be safeguarded through biodiversity/ecological buffer zones/corridors to protect aspects such as riparian habitats and species; water quality and provide for flood plain capacity. Proposals will be permitted where they do not have an adverse impact on the nature conservation, fisheries, public access or water related recreation use of the rivers in the County.

Proposals will wherever possible be required to make efficient use of water resources.

Policy EP2 Pollution - Proposals for development should wherever possible seek to minimise the impacts of pollution. New developments will be required to demonstrate that they:

- EP2 a.** Do not conflict with National Air Quality Strategy objectives, or adversely affect to a significant extent, designated Air Quality Management Areas (permitted developments may be conditioned to abide by best practice);
- EP2 b.** Do not cause a deterioration in water quality;
- EP2 c.** Ensure that light and noise pollution are where appropriate minimised;
- EP2 d.** Ensure that risks arising from contaminated land are addressed through an appropriate land investigation and assessment of risk and land remediation to ensure its suitability for the proposed use.

Policy EP3 Sustainable Drainage – Proposals for development will be required to demonstrate that the impact of surface water drainage, including the effectiveness of incorporating Sustainable Drainage Systems (SUDS), has been fully investigated.

Community and Town Councils

The Panel continues to mandate payments for the extra costs of working from home and payments for office consumables. There is no change to the Determination made last year.

Mandatory payments: determination 7

Payment for extra costs of working from home

All councils must pay their members £156 a year (equivalent to £3 a week) towards the extra household expenses (including heating, lighting, power and broadband) of working from home.

Set payment for consumables

Councils must either pay their members £52 a year for the cost of office consumables required to carry out their role, or alternatively councils must enable members to claim full reimbursement for the cost of their office consumables.

It is a matter for each council to make and record a policy decision in respect of when and how the payments are made and whether they are paid monthly, yearly or otherwise. The policy should also state whether and how to recover any payments made to a member who leaves or changes their role during the financial year.

Compensation for financial loss: determination 8

Compensation for financial loss is an optional payment.

Previously, the Panel determined that an appropriate level of payment should be set at the daily rate of ASHE. To maintain this link, the figures for 2025 to 2026 are now proposed as:

£126.74 for a full day and £63.37 for a half day.

Reporting requirements: determination 9

Community and Town Councils are required to submit an annual statement of payments to the Panel by the 30 September each year, and also publish this on their website. The Panel have provided a template return for clerks to use.

The Panel have discussed and considered changing the requirements for Community and Town Councils when submitting their statement of payment returns. The Panel's aim is to simplify administration and encourage Councils to ensure all mandatory payments are made to individual members.

The Panel proposed that from September 2024, the returns need only show the total amounts paid in respect of the mandatory payments mentioned above. That is the £156 contribution to the costs of working from home and the £52 set rate consumables allowance and the travel and subsistence expenses paid.

This brings these in line with the reporting of the costs of care and personal assistance allowances.

(PUBLIC FOOTPATHS 72/30 & 72/31 PENTRE AWEL, LLANELLI)
PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER 2024**

The above order was made on the 2nd October 2024. The effect of the Order will be to divert the public footpath 72/30 from New Dock Street proceeding in a southerly direction to a point southeast of the New Dafen and its junction with footpath 72/31. Then turning Westerly before terminating at a point south of the New Dafen and create an alternative footpath instead on a line running from a point south of New Dock Street proceeding south easterly to a point northeast of the New Dafen, then continuing southerly to a point southeast of the New Dafen and its junction with the proposed footpath 72/31/2. The footpath continues westerly along the south side of the New Dafen to the B4304, then turning northerly past a sluice gate to a point southeast of a roundabout. The footpath then continues easterly to a fork in the path. Proceeding north from the fork, the footpath continues for 83 metres to its junction with Northumberland Road. Continuing easterly from the fork, the footpath continues to another fork. Proceeding north from the fork, the footpath continues to its junction with Northumberland Road. Proceeding easterly from the fork, the footpath continues to a point northeast of the New Dafen, as shown on the Order map.

The effect of the Order will be to divert the public footpath 72/31 from a point southeast of the New Dafen and its junction with footpath 72/30, proceeding easterly to its junction with The Avenue and create an alternative footpath instead on a line running from a point southeast of the New Dafen and its junction with the proposed footpath 72/30/3, proceeding southerly join footpath 72/31 link 1, as shown on the Order map.

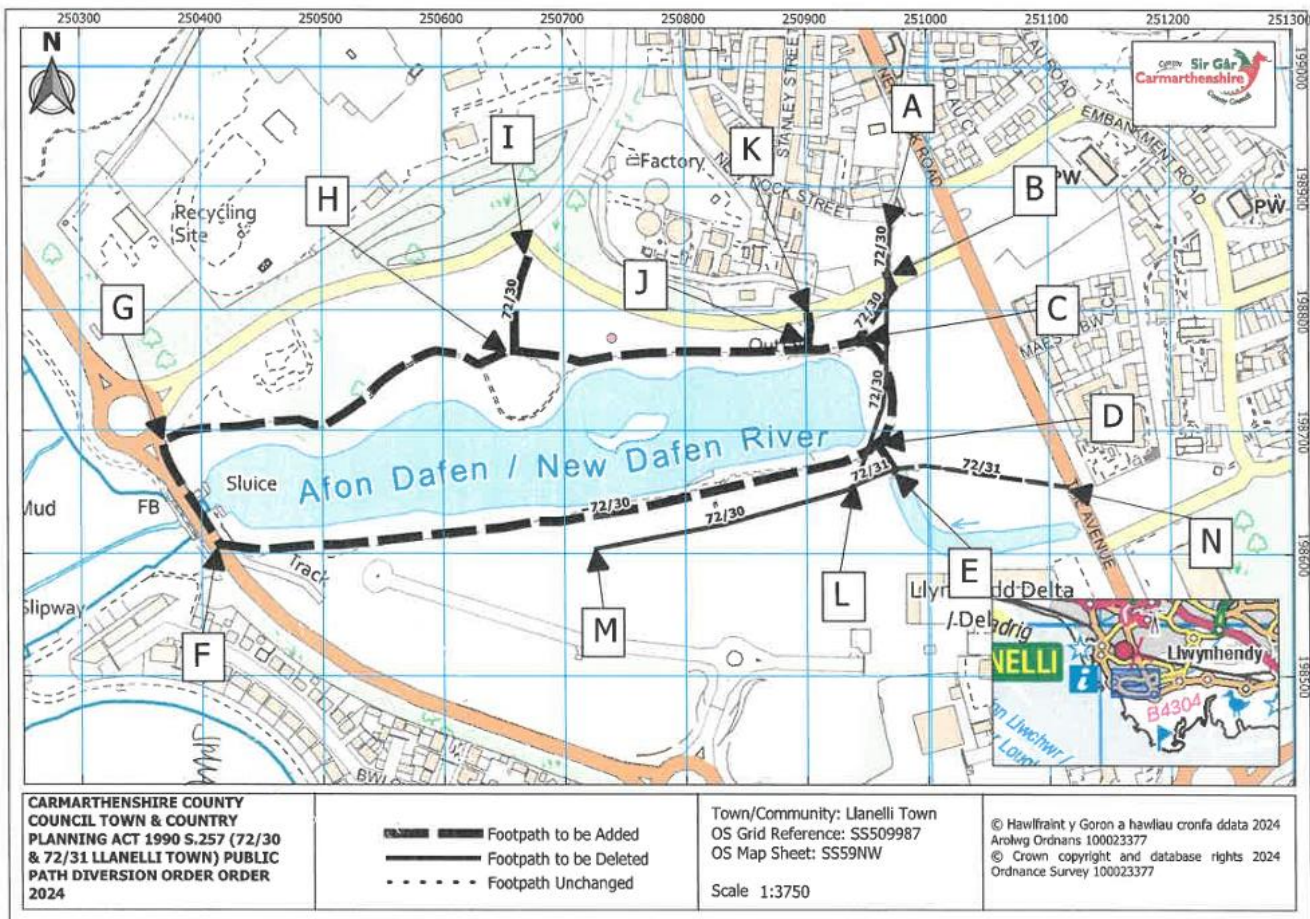

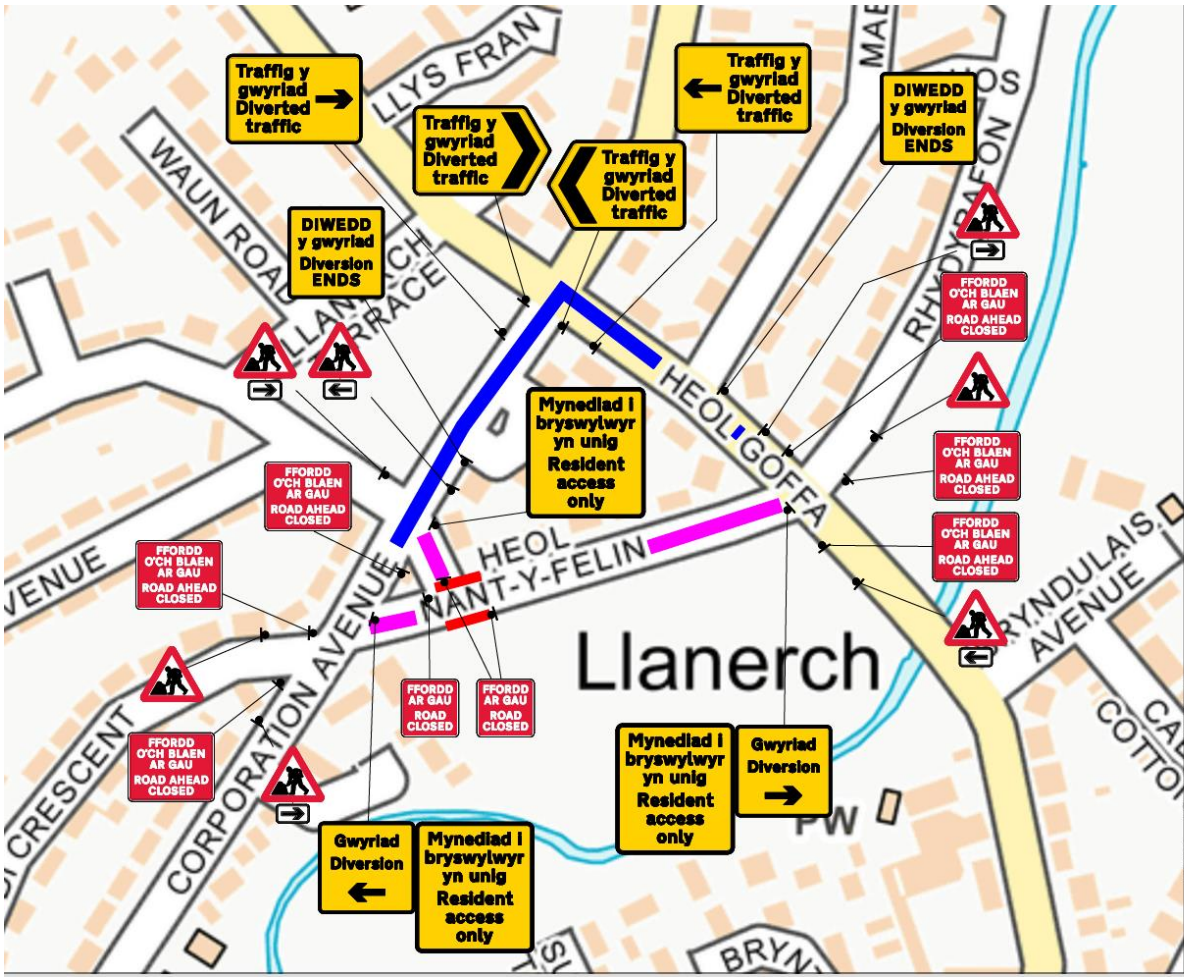

ORDER UNDER SECTION 21 OF THE TOWN POLICE CLAUSES ACT 1847

FOR THE PREVENTION OF OBSTRUCTION

On Sunday 10th November 2024, for the Llanelli Remembrance Service, the following streets will be thronged and liable for obstruction.

1. Between the hours of 08:30 and 12:30:

- a) Church Street, Llanelli, from its junction with Station Road to its junction with Gelli Onn
- b) Vauxhall Road, Llanelli (for its entire length)
- c) Waunlanyrafon, Llanelli, from its junction with Park Crescent to its junction with the A214

2. Between the hours of 08:30 and 10:30:

- a) Murray Street, Llanelli, from its junction with the Asda Roundabout to its junction with Station Road.

The Alternative Route for south-eastbound traffic will be to proceed along Gelli Onn, Thomas Street, Water Street, Stepney Place, Upper Robinsons Street and Murray Street. Vice Versa for Northwest bound diverted traffic.

The CARMARTHENSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL pursuant to powers conferred by Section 21 of the Town Police Clauses Act 1847 DOES HEREBY ORDER AND DIRECT that for the purpose of preventing obstruction on the above mentioned roads, shall be closed to all vehicular traffic including pedal cycles between the hours indicated above on Sunday 10th November 2024 subject to emergency service vehicles being allowed access to the street without delay in the event of an emergency.

This Order will not prevent any person from causing any vehicle to proceed or to wait on or in the said lengths of road referred to therein if the vehicle is being used for fire brigade purposes or an ambulance or a vehicle in the service of a police force in any such case being used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties.

Any person directed or permitted by a Police Constable in uniform to drive, ride or propel a vehicle or to cause or permit a vehicle to wait on or in the said lengths of road described in this Order during the said hours on the said days shall obey the direction of the said police constable, and of any other police constable in uniform, PCSO or other authorised person.

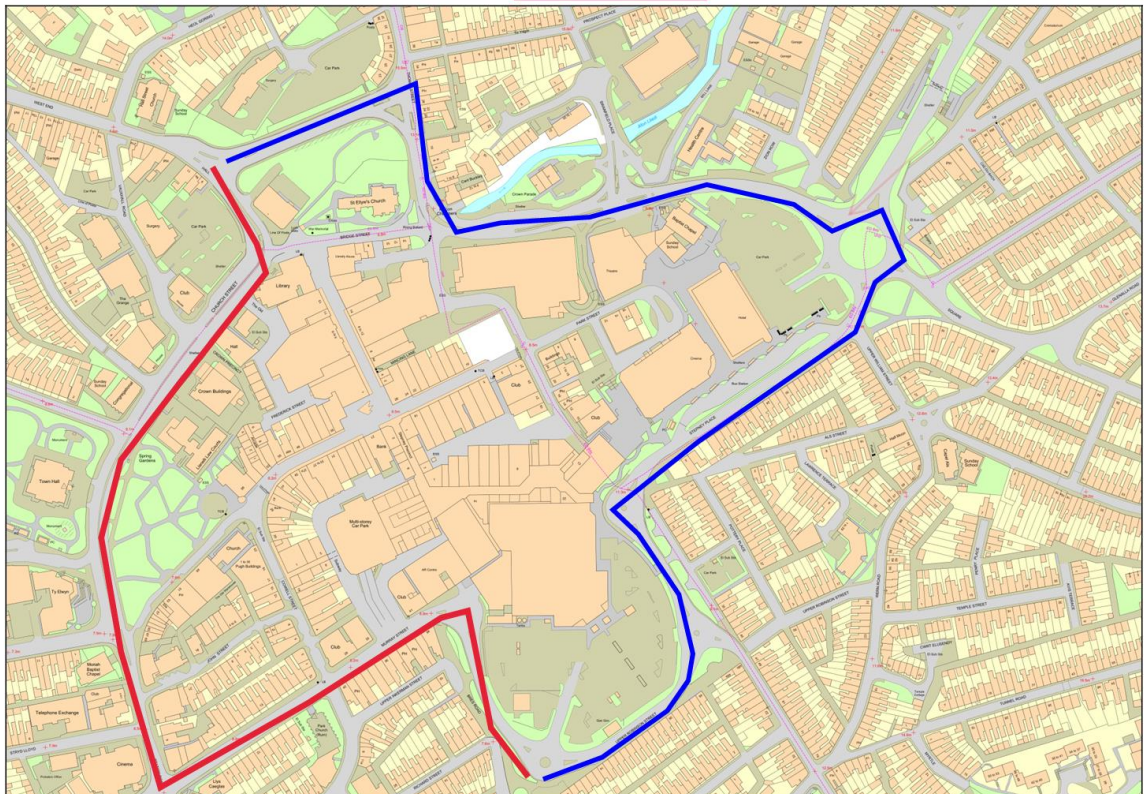
